Whether the Academic Council would approve the eligibility criteria for guiding scholars PhD in University as recommended by the committee and to modify the Academic Regulations in this regard.

Approved the Eligibility Criteria from 2022 admission onwards as follows:

Clause No. 15.6.b of the Academic Regulations for the Ph.D. programmes in KVASU is modified as:

A permanent faculty member of KVASU with Ph.D. having five published scientific articles in Internationally/ Nationally rated journals as First Author/ Corresponding Author and with a minimum of one successfully guided P.G. (M.V.Sc/M.Tech/ M.Sc/M.S.) thesis supervision as Major Advisor or a minimum of three successfully guided (M.V.Sc/M.Tech/M.Sc/M.S.) thesis supervision as Minor Advisor will be mandatory to be a chairperson/ Major Advisor of a doctoral candidate.

Clause No. 13.4 of the Academic Regulations for the Ph.D. programme in Biosciences is modified

A permanent faculty member of KVASU with Ph.D. having five published scientific articles in Internationally/ Nationally rated journals as First Author/ Corresponding Author and with a minimum of one successfully guided P.G.

(M.V.Sc /M.Tech/M.Sc/M.S.) thesis supervision as Major Advisor or a minimum of three successfully guided P.G. (M.V.Sc/M.Tech/M.Sc/M.S.) thesis supervision as Minor Advisor will be mandatory to be a chairperson/ Major Advisor of a doctoral candidate. The Major Advisor will be decided by the HoUD on rotation basis. The number of students that can be guided by a teacher as Major Advisor as per the existing regulations of the University shall be inclusive of Ph.D. Biosciences programmes also.

• The recommendation of the committee to include an additional clause in the KVASU Academic regulations governing research supervisor ship viz. "the maximum number of research students that a teacher can guide at a time as Major Advisor may be limited to four" is not accepted since decision regarding that has already been taken in the 35th Academic Council.

(Action: Acad A1 section)

After the discussion on agenda notes, the Council decided to review its decision to implement the amendment to academic regulations approved in the 35th Academic Council (item no. 35.D.4) regarding advisory committee only from 2022 admission onwards for all programmes. The Council has congratulated the chair for having received the honour of best Veterinarian from VCI.

The meeting came to an end by 3.20 PM with the vote of thanks from the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor.
